

But the law expert wanted to show that the way he was living was right, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"



A man named Selepe built a circular house and lived alone in the forest. He went out one day to hunt. Along the way he saw ants helping each other carry food to store for the winter. He sat down to watch them. He noticed that the ants worked well with their neighbours.

A single ant can carry a big stick with its small body, but ants are also wise and they work well together. He learned a lot from the ants but he found it difficult to apply these lessons to his own life, because he lived alone.

When he got home he found a hungry dog he didn't know and he chased it away.



The next morning Selepe went to the river to draw water in a bucket. The water was full of frogs and tadpoles. He took them out so that he could draw clear water. On the way home, the bucket began to leak, and he went back thirsty. His body became weak and he lacked the strength to walk.

When he saw the dog in the distance he called out to it. It came and sat down beside him, barking. Then a donkey came, carried him and sat him down among a crowd of people. They gave him food and water to drink. His heart changed when he remembered how the ants helped each other, and he realised that helping others is a good thing to do. He also realised he wasn't the only person in the world, and that he shouldn't be so selfish.

He moved out of the circular house, and went to live among the people, where he taught them about the wisdom of the ants and how people should help each other.



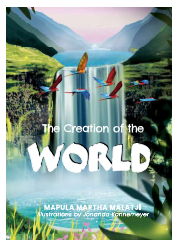

love.

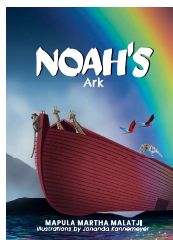

teach about ants?

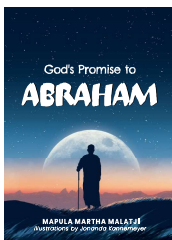
