After the ceremony, Phuti apologised to Pheny, and Pheny forgave him.



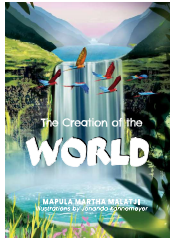
Prayer

Father God, I come to You in Jesus' name. From today, teach me to be free from envy and hatred. Please help me to walk in Your way.

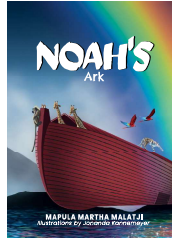
