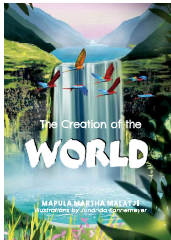
## **Prayer**

Dear Lord, even when other children do what is wrong, please help me not to behave badly. Please help me to obey You and the people You have put in my life, like my parents and teachers.

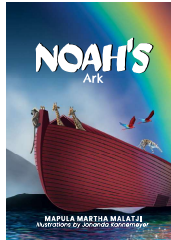

5. When the goat's singing job was over, what did it do?

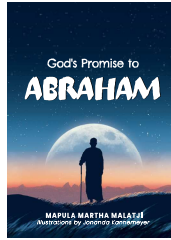
